WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

Type	Martin Currie Asia Unconstrained Trust plc is an investment trust and is a public limited company, with shares listed on the London Stock Exchange. It invests in the shares of other companies. Shares of the product are bought and sold via markets. Typically, at any given time on any given day, the price you pay for a share will be higher than the price at which you could sell it. The product has borrowed to purchase assets. This will magnify any gains or losses made.
Objective	To deliver a strategy that captures the Asian region's nominal GDP growth measured on a three-year rolling basis.
Intended retail investor	This product is intended for investors who are prepared to take on risk of loss to their original capital in order to get a higher potential return, and who plan to stay invested for at least 5 years. It is intended to form part of a portfolio of investments.
Maturity	There is no maturity date.
Continuation	The company undertakes a continuation vote every three years. The next vote is scheduled for July 2021. If shareholders vote against continuation, the assets will be sold, cash returned to shareholders, and the company will be wound up, unless the Board make alternative proposals approved by shareholders.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND WHAT COULD I GET IN RETURN?

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for five years.

The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or you may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

In accordance with legislation, we have classified this product as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. Please note that even the lowest risk class can lose you money and, that extreme adverse market conditions can mean you suffer severe losses in all cases.

The summary risk indicator only reflects historic share price volatility of the company's shares. It excludes other risks inherent in the product and, therefore, does not show the full risk to the investor.

The following are some of the other risks materially relevant to the PRIIP which are not covered in the summary risk indicator:

- The product may borrow money which is known as 'gearing' which can enhance gains in rising markets but magnify losses in falling markets.
- The majority of management fees will be deducted from the capital of the company which will constrain capital growth in order to maintain income streams.
- Investing in foreign markets introduces a risk where adverse movements in currency exchange rates could result in a decrease in the value of your investment.
- Emerging or less developed markets may face more political, economic or structural challenges than developed countries. Investment in these markets is generally characterised by higher levels of volatility and risk than fully developed markets.

This table shows the money you could get back over the next 5 years under different scenarios, assuming that you invest £10,000. The performance scenarios have been calculated on historical performance figures based on the past 5 years when markets have been favourable. WHAT HAPPENS IF MARTIN CURRIE FUND MANAGEMENT LIMITED IS UNABLE TO PAY OUT?

As the shares are not traded directly with the Trust or PRIIP Manufacturer (MCFM) rather they are traded on the London Stock Exchange, any direct holding of these shares is not covered by the Financial Services Compensation Scheme (FSCS) in the event MCFM or the Trust are unable to pay out.

WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

The Reduction in Yield (RIY) shows what impact the total costs you pay will have on the investment return you might get. The total costs take into account one-off, ongoing and incidental costs.

The amounts shown here are the cumulative costs of the product itself, for three different holding periods. They include potential early exit penalties. The figures assume you invest £10,000. The figures are estimates and may change in the future.

The person selling you or advising you about this product may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs, and show you the impact that all costs will have on your investment over time.

HOW LONG SHOULD I HOLD IT AND CAN I TAKE OUT MONEY EARLY?

Recommended holding period: 5 years

This product has no minimum holding period, but it is designed for long-term investment, you should be prepared to stay invested for at least 5 years. You can sell your shares in the product on any day that the London Stock Exchange is open. At any time the value of your investment is based on the market value of the shares (the share price) multiplied by the number of shares you own.
